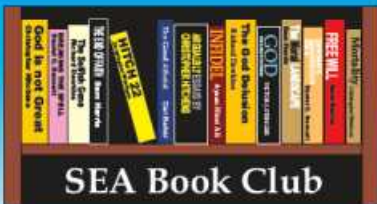
SEA Monthly ROUNDTABLE

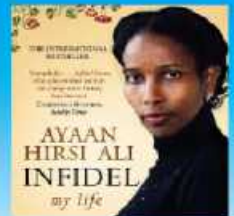
